WELCOME TO THE PEDERSEN'S

I feel I have known about MMM for about 20 years at least. There has always been a thought in the back of my mind that one day I will go and serve with those guys. I just didn't realise the 'one day' was going to come up so suddenly - like, right now!

I was born in Denmark which may explain my unusual name, Lejf, (pronounced Life). I was born into a religious district, there was a lot of state religion in Denmark, so you do Christian things. I was christened and went to Sunday School as a child and was confirmed when I was 14. When I left home at 18, I thought, "Because I am a good person and God is a good God, because I have done 'right' things that was required of me. I am a Christian and I would go to heaven when I died." That was the theology I left home with and I was quite content with that.



I did my electrical training and then travelled around Europe. I ended up in Israel, of all places, and I spent a few months there. There I discovered the places I had heard of in Sunday School and realized they were real places. That made me think, "If these places are real, perhaps the people who lived and walked here must have been real too." That was an eye opener to me. I also got to rub shoulders with some genuine believers while I was there, and I saw they had something I didn't have. I didn't know what it was - I didn't really even know what questions to ask. Then I ended up in North West England at a place called Capernwray Hall. There I joined the maintenance team as a Christian because you know, I have always been a Christian. But there was this thing, these people have something I don't have and I don't know what it is. It was after a couple months, that God revealed clearly to me, through a conversation I had that I was a sinner. Here I was 25 years old, no idea that there was even sin in me, but once I understood, I gave my life to the Lord. Suddenly, the story about Jesus being crucified made sense. It always saddened me that God let Jesus die on the cross, such a cruel thing, but now I understood it was just so exciting.

I spent a couple years in England and went back to Denmark for a couple years, then God laid it on my heart, you need to go to Bible School. My thought was Capernwray New Zealand, I didn't think of going anywhere else, so I went to Monavale, Cambridge to the Bible School and did a year's course there. It was during that year that I learnt a lot about God, Jesus and myself and became very friendly with one of the staff members at Capernwray – which does happen sometimes, we have three kids now, that's the short version of that story. I never really left Capernwray, I stayed on and became the Maintenance Manager which is what I have done for over 20 years now.

Now, with Capernwray coming to a standstill (due to Covid-19), I was looking around thinking when what can I do now? There was plenty I could do but I didn't really want to go and do it, the only thing in the back of my

mind was I would like to go and serve with MMM. But there are some obstacles in the way, and they were just too big, so I didn't want to go and do it. The obstacles were -they may not want me, I'm not really able to be mobile, and there is the financial side of raising support, so it was all just too much. But when MMM invited me to join and it was arranged that I don't have to travel all over New Zealand, I can just work in the Waikato that was a couple things that was settled but there was the financial side. It is nice to know you get paid once a month you know where the money is going to come from for food and all your bills. But to not have that was so foreign to my mind I didn't feel I could do it.

But then God just clearly revealed through scripture that he can look after anything. There is that saying, "It is easy to believe in God when we food on the table and money in our pocket." But when we don't know where the money for the food is going to come from it's a different story. In our home group we were going through Marks Gospel and we had gone through how Jesus had fed the 5,000 and then he went on to feed the 4,000 and then straight after that there is a passage where the disciples realise, "oh, no we forgot to bring bread! Oh, what are we going to eat?" It's like Jesus really rips into them and says, "Haven't you understood anything. Haven't you got eyes to see and ears to hear?" Didn't you learn anything from those two miracles? The night I was leading the study I was saying, "We have to have faith in God, we have to believe he is going to provide." And to myself I'm saying, "Man, I actually have to live this out. "That was really the turning point where I realised I have to step out in faith.

It is wonderful to have Lejf on the MMm Team. Lejf is well known to the Christian community around the Waikato and is a great blessing to the team. Lejf was encouraged to pursue his desire to serve with MMM by his wife Lynette and family, Anita, Emma and Lucas.

The last 6 weeks have been so jam packed, sleeping in 6 different places in that time in Pirongia, Lower Hutt, Kāpiti and Tairua. We have done so much and seen so many places and people. They have been good, crazy, busy, chaotic, exciting, fun, but also at times, kinda hard and full on.

We have been able to use the opportunity so far to explore these areas with the kids - we are so lucky to live in an amazing country where there is so much to see and do. We have done bike rides and walks, explored beaches, local parks and libraries. We even fit in a week of swimming lessons for the kids and catching up with friends and family when in Kāpiti. We have been to Cathedral Cove, Hot Water Beach and Pauanui. The kids loved Hot Water Beach and are keen to go back... but who wouldn't love lying in hot water at the beach for a couple of hours in the middle of winter?!

I see the kids growing in resilience and perseverance as they are continually put in new situations, having new experiences and with new people. This is something that couldn't be learnt if they weren't put outside of their comfort zones.

So there has been lots to keep us busy, but also heaps of change. I have been reminded that one thing we can be sure of in life and in



our new journey is that there will be different seasons, but none of them last forever and even in the depths of the dark winters where there maybe a lot of chaos and confusion, the new life of spring isn't too far away... but we need those hard bits to learn how to persevere so we can really grow when spring comes.

For those who know me it may be a surprise to some that I don't actually like going to new places and meeting new people all the time, I actually quite like just being around the people I already know well. But as I walked alone along Tairua's Ocean Beach one evening looking out at the incredible view I was reminded that sometimes you gotta make yourself vulnerable and uncomfortable to see the beauty that was there all along. I wouldn't have been able to see that view or had the experiences our family have had in the last six weeks if we were still living our comfortable lives in Waikanae. The kids all told me that as the week of their swimming lessons went on, it got easier and I think it's true, doing new stuff isn't always easy... but slowly it becomes easier when you keep at it.

We continue to be humbled and overwhelmed by the generosity, encouragement, support and prayers of so many people who help us negotiate these changing seasons.

Jane Trongton, Canterbury

The house we were to help renovate was built in 1864, it had been 3/4 re-piled and new flooring installed, there was no back wall in the house and only the kitchen area had been framed. So where do you start? With a time frame of two weeks, and rain and snow expected for the next two weeks. Sadly the weather report was correct, there was enough rain fall to create two creeks flowing outside, one on the road and one where it belonged, but first things first, on the upside there were lots of borer ridden planks and beams for the fire so we kept warm!

Jane, the owner of the house, has been in full-time Christian ministry serving in prayer in mission for over 30 years. For the last three years she has been travelling nationally and internationally to see the body of Christ stand in unity to Bless Israel. Now Jane feels the Lord has called her to set up a home that she can share and be a place of prayer.

Paul Galbraith, a builder, his first project with MMM, was made the project leader. Not an easy task, but he also had a look at the project before hand. He decided the foundation and flooring needed to be replaced, the back wall framing, including new backdoor and larger windows, needed to be done first.

We created a paint area inside the lounge, to under-coat the new weather boards for the back wall, as painting outside was impossible. This got done by Femmy and Andrea over a 2 day period.

The guys worked mainly on the foundation, flooring and back wall framing. This also included digging out the clay underneath the floor to 400 mm, to create airflow under the house. Not a great job when there is constant rain, it makes things rather slippery. The ladies did their fair

share of digging and carting clay. Jane now has a clay garden. We also used the rocks that held up the house for a rock garden. At MMM, we do it all, rain or shine.

We did what we could inside, straighten the walls where needed, put dwangs between all the studs, fit corner framing etc. to fit the Gib later on.

The rain only stopped on the last day, to give us time to remove the gutters, fit the braicing ply to the back wall and rehang the gutters. The foundation and flooring also got finished on the last day.

I would like to thank the whole team for their positive spirit, the jokes, (mainly about the weather) and the great fellowship. - *Gerrard van Leeuwen. The Team consisted of Gerard and Femmy van Leeuwen, Paul and Helen Galbraith, Peter and Andrea Cooper and Dave Festing.*
