Here is their reflection on the year and what they learned.



Three Hundred and sixty-eight days, just over a year. It sounds like a lot but looking back at the year that has been for us as a family working and travelling with MMM it has gone by in a flash. From our orientation at the MMM Centre in Pirongia, all the way to our last project with the Gloriavale Leavers Trust in Timaru, our year has been filled with new places, new friends, lots of adventures and ups and downs (but mostly ups!).

We have got to have so many experiences that we would have never been able to have otherwise - we attended churches and found out about ministries we had never heard of, got the opportunity to live and work alongside brothers and sisters of different backgrounds, been encouraged, challenged and sharpened in our faith.

We got to experience New Zealand outside of our home in a new way, not as tourists, but as people joining and living in communities, getting to know the locals and the church and the area.

We survived living with three young children in a caravan and, as my husband likes to remind me, we didn't just survive, we thrived!

It's a bit surreal being back in our old house, seeing old friends and family, going to places so familiar but that we haven't seen in so long. In some ways it feels like we have never left, but in others it feels like we have been away for longer, having been filled with so much more than a year's worth of experiences, challenges, joys and relationships. We have found so much joy in seeing the Church of God, in its various forms, denominations and ministries, finding ways to share God's love and Gospel to those around them. We have seen many give up time and money, putting others first, following the example of Jesus - these are the people we want to be like.

The body of Christ is a beautiful thing and when we see the different parts working together with a common purpose - for the Glory of God - amazing things can happen. We not only got to see buildings be transformed this year but got to see how people are being transformed through the ministries we serve.

Our chapter serving full-time with MMM is over for now, but our ethos for living life in Dunedin is still the same: To God be the Glory. - Jen McLean
