What projects have you served on and what did you do?

to work with great guys and I like that we have a devotional every day at morning tea. It's a great, safe work environment for young men like myself. I also like using power tools and building things.

HOGAN'S FIJI UPDATE!

Roy and Rachael, Joshua, Gabrille and Caleb joined MMM at the beginning of last year to take up the role of MMM Fiji Project Coordinators. The plan was always that they would serve with MMM New Zealand before departing for Fiji but with the advent of the term COVID, that timeline has changed. Here is an update from the family.

MMM NZ usually sends short term teams to Fiji regularly between March and October each year. This works best when MMM have Full-Time Team members in Fiji assessing projects and leading the teams. Due to COVID, we are now in a place of not knowing when MMM can send teams back.


At the start of 2020 MMM had nine projects lined up in Fiji. Some only to be cancelled weeks before leaving due to COVID.

However, our family has already been on a long journey in this call to Fiji and we don't plan on letting COVID stop us.

Fiji has been hit hard by COVID, with many of their population relying on tourism for employment. Added to that, with a couple of decent cyclones thrown in which have destroyed buildings and crops Fiji is still in real need of help.

Although Fiji still has its borders closed to tourists, they are currently letting in people on various visas including New Zealanders on 'volunteer work permits'. We have taken that opportunity and submitted our application for work permits and are waiting to hear back.

This has been a bit of a process and there are still many things to be worked



Once our work permits are granted and we are able to go to Fiji, we will be able to work on projects with locals giving us the opportunity to encourage, support and teach them new skills. We will look forward to having teams from New Zealand join us when able.

Please pray for our family for the process and timing of relocating to Fiji. - Rachael Hogan

'DO IT TO **SERVE GOD"** JAMES PASK'S FAREWELL WORDS

"Don't do it just to serve MMM, because MMM is just an organisation, but do it to serve God. You have to do it because God has called vou and he wants you to do it." This was James Pask's response when asked what advice he had for anyone considering serving with MMM.

On Saturday, 13th February, around 70 people gathered at Te Awamutu Bible Chapel for a dinner to farewell James Pask, who has been serving with MMM Full-Time since 2015 and volunteering for a number of years before then.

We had to do some archive digging to find out just when James first volunteered with MMM and concluded he was on a project back in 1999! Since then he has served in Fiji and in New Zealand, going as far North as Kaeo and as far south as Woodend just north of Christchurch.

When asked if there was a project that stood out as a favourite, James didn't hesitate to say it was the Matamata Christian School, not because of the project itself but because of the Christian unity that was there. Even when James

first went just to look at the project, the first thing they did was to all sit around a table and pray. That's when James knew it was going to be a great project.

James says that he has always enjoyed working with MMM because you are working with the Christian community and for the Christian community. He enjoys leaving a place you are serving better than you found it. When asked what he didn't like, there was a very short

answer, "Grumpy people." Fortunately, in MMM we don't have too many of those!

At the farewell dinner, Howard Robinson, the MMM Director, made it clear James always did a top job and recalled the way James would speak of , "The joy of serving".

In response to the question, "Has your Christian life grown or has there been any answers to prayer over your time with MMM?" James replied, "I would like to hope my Christian faith would have grown regardless of whether I was in MMM or not. I think pushing into the Word and praying, the morning tea times when we all share have been really great." He mentioned that there have been many answers over the years and recalled going to a project in Whanganui at a time when it was forecast to have thunderstorms and flooding. The MMM Project Coordinator was telling them not to go but James said, "We have planned to go, so we are going, we are just going to trust God." They all sat down and prayed and once on the project they only had one day when they couldn't work; the rest of the time

they could keep going and they got the job done. That project was the Wai Ora Christian Community Trust. God is good!

James did admit there has been a cost to serving with MMM. There is more rust in his van now than when he began and many of his tools have needed replacing but James concluded, "If you are going to serve the Lord you have to count the cost; before you go, and who cares what it cost, the thing is you have been obedient to God and got out and served him." In his final word James added that MMM needs to be intentional and not scared to

step out in faith, "Look what happened when you (MMM) stepped out and bought the property. We can never underestimate God's power." - Ave Robinson

Thank you, James. Your many skills have blessed Churches and ministries around New Zealand and MMM is grateful for your faithful service over the years. May God continue to bless you in the future.

Have you learnt any new skills on a project?


I've learnt multiple things during projects, from how to paint a wall (properly) to things like operating a drop-saw!


Student Life, Dunedin
