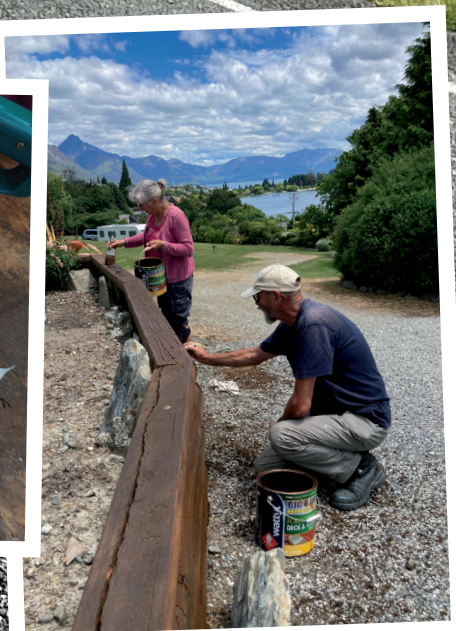

LETTER FROM THE

Director March 2022

Don't become **WEARY** Burden-bearers

At the first team meeting for this year Tom McIvor, who is the Zone Leader Indo-Pacific Rim at Word of Life International Fellowship, was invited to bring a word of encouragement to begin the year. Tom shared with the team some thoughts from Galatians chapter 6. The following is a summary of what Tom shared.

"Carry each other's burdens, and in this way, you will fulfil the law of Christ." Tom began with getting the team to read Galatians 6 from which he drew the thought that MMM is a carrier of other's burdens, a clear Biblical principal. I'm not sure if you consider buildings a burden but for busy people in ministry having to stop to work on buildings, "burden" would be the correct term. The notes of thanks and appreciation MMM receives following projects would also clearly illustrate a burden has indeed been lifted!

Tom went on to explain the passage, continuing from verse 3 which reads, "If anyone thinks they are something when they are not, they deceive themselves." He warned us against pride; not against pride in what we do as we should always seek to do a top job, but in our attitude. Our attitude should be humble.

In verse 4 we read, "Each one should test their own actions." As Christians we should be self-examiners. We need to be checking on our own hearts, where they are set each day, asking ourselves, is my heart surrendered to God today? What great advice to begin the year with, don't you think?

In verse 6 there is the instruction to the church to "share with those who teach," and with MMM's ministry of serving we do that; we support those who are on the frontline, thereby carrying their burden.

"A man reaps what he sows," we read in verse 7. Tom reminded us that this is true in every aspect of life. In fleshly things that are listed previously in chapter 5, "The acts of the flesh are obvious: sexual immorality ... hatred, discord, jealousy, fits of rage, selfish ambition, dissensions, factions and envy" In every aspect of life, we have to be careful what we sow. It starts with a little seed ... then you can't get it out of your mind. It might just a simple thought - maybe, "That person doesn't care", "That person said something", "That person joked about me", "That person didn't recognise me" - they are the works of the flesh. When we allow that to grow there is a reaping,

and it reaps what? Destruction, resentment, self-pity, loss of joy. It is never okay to let the flesh overcome.

The passage goes on, "Those who sow to the spirit reap eternal life." We must allow the fruit of the spirit. What is the fruit of the spirit? We all know - love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. They are the fruit of the spirit that we need. Tom suggested that every day each one of us must surrender to the Spirit; examine ourselves - is the flesh having part of me today? Every day we must let the fruit of the Spirit pervade our souls.

"Don't become weary in doing good," reads verse 9. There are times when we feel weary and wonder if we really have made a difference. Tom encouraged us to not lose heart. He said, there will be times when you think, "This task is just too big for us, or Where have we made a difference? But I know, as someone who travels all over this country and visits many ministries, you do make a difference, MMM is a blessing to many."

In the closing words at the end of chapter we read the Apostle Paul's words, "God forbid that I should boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ" Tom closed by exhorting us to remember, "In all that you boast, we do what we do because of Jesus Christ, not because we have been given some great talent, not because you have a great heart but because of Jesus Christ. My boast is in Christ Jesus, under his umbrella for his glory." - Amen

Our sincere thanks to Tom for giving such an excellent encouragement as we start the year.

FROM OUR INBOX...



Last year we served the Tasman Bible Church. Recently we received this update from Mike Nicholls, the Project Leader, "I caught up with the pastor from Tasman. He shared a couple of stories. When we were there I installed a light to come on at night to light up where they were going to install a cross. For a few weeks it shone on a blank wall. When the cross was installed it

challenged someone to re-dedicate their life to Christ and come back to church. The other story was about a couple who had a domestic dispute and one left in the car in a terrible state of mind. They drove past the lit cross and felt such peace that they drove back and parked under it and fell asleep." - Praise the Lord!

BUILDING ON PRAYER

This article was written following a recent team meeting. At that meeting we talked around how prayer can be seen as different parts of a building structure. Below are some of the building metaphors to explain why MMM needs your prayer support, which is greatly valued by all involved in God's work.



Foundations: the first part of any build must be the foundations on which the building will stand. The purpose of a strong foundation is to provide stability from the ground up. *"For no man can lay a foundation other than the one which is laid, which is Jesus Christ."* 1 Corinthians 3:11. Therefore the ministry of MMM must be built on prayer with Christ our redeemer as the foundation. Without our firm foundation in Christ alone everything will collapse, as Matthew tells us in chapter 7: 24-27 in the story of the wise and foolish builders.



Buttress: a structure of stone, timber or brick, built against a wall to strengthen or for support. It helps to hold the wall in place. I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me. Philippians 4:13. Knowing MMM has prayer support gives the organisation the strength to carry on:

- when a project might be difficult
- when a team member is facing health concerns, and
- even navigating our way through a pandemic, with plans needing to change or adjustments made.



Acrow Props: these give temporary support to a structure, that might need stabilising whilst a permanent solution can be made. Sometimes it can take a while for our prayers to be answered, but we still need to hold on to the promise that God hears our prayers and will answer in his own time. At MMM we are very much aware that those who pray for us are holding up the ministry. Moses held up his arms during a battle with Amalekites and he was supported by Aaron and Hur (Exodus 17: 8-13).



Beam: or a cross beam holds everything together. MMM ministry is based around the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, who died and rose again. Everything that MMM does, is to glorify God and to build his kingdom. *Let us keep our eyes fixed on Jesus, on whom our faith depends from beginning to end. He did not give up because of the cross! On the contrary, because of the joy that was waiting for him, he thought nothing of the disgrace of dying on the cross, and he is now seated at the right side of God's throne. Hebrews 12:2*



Truss: this member is capable of supporting considerable external load over a large span. It is made up of individual pieces designed and needed to carry that load. The Truss reminds MMM'ers this work is not done alone, but through the power of the Holy Spirit, the love of God the Father and through the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. (Ephesians 4:4-6)

Prayer Answered

GOD'S CURRENCY

The Hogan family joined MMM June 2020 with the desire to move to Fiji to lead MMM Fiji. There was a plan on what that would look like but then a Global Pandemic popped up. Here they share their journey of the last couple of years.

It can be a scary thing, getting out of the boat and putting full faith in God to meet your needs. If this pandemic has taught us anything, surely it's that we don't know what tomorrow will bring and anything could happen.

But we also know that, as followers of Jesus, the best place to be is where He wants us to be, doing what He wants us to do. For those of us that are Full Time Volunteers for MMM, that means trusting that God will meet our needs every day. This is something as a family we have been learning - that is to live in a deeper trust of our Saviour as our provider, and he has not let us down. In fact he knows how to give "immeasurably more than we could ask for or imagine." Ephesians 3:20.

For our family, it has also been trusting that God knows the perfect timing for us as we prepare to move to Fiji. This has been a bit of a rollercoaster, but a good lesson where we can trust that God knows the timing better than we ever could and His picture is way bigger than ours. Our job is just to do our bit and be obedient.

Despite being Full Time Volunteers, God never ceases to amaze us with the way he is able to go before and supply our needs. Here are just a few of the many ways we have seen God provide for our family:

- We finished raising our financial support needed to start with MMM during the first lockdown in New Zealand, a time of a national and global financial crisis.
- During 2021 we had ongoing car issues, with three separate problems. This put us without a car for a month. Yet we were lent a car the whole time and all costs were covered by three separate financial gifts given by people who were unaware of the problems.
- The same day that approximately \$1500 went out of our account for our Fijian work permit application, a financial gift came in from someone who had prayed asking who to give money to and felt led to give to us.
- We were given a one off financial gift the week we were in Christchurch on annual leave and then again from someone different when we were in Queenstown, to allow us to do some touristy things including a cruise in Milford Sound.
- We sold Roy's old work van on TradeMe for \$2000 more than we expected to sell it for after trying to sell it for months.

We joke that God uses a different currency. We are often gifted things which allow us to not need money in the first place, like free upgrades for paid accommodation, free accommodation, meals and being given food and produce.

The last two years have taken us on a journey exploring from Northland to Southland and many places in between. It has been everything from a big extended holiday to a whole lot of hard work. Although it's all been for Work Projects, we have managed to fit in many exciting adventures along the way, from visiting Tane Mahuta in Northland to whale watching in Kaikoura, kayaking in Kaiteriteri, checking out incredible views up Te Mata Peak in the Hawkes Bay and cruising the Milford Sound. We have also been able to see friends and family around New Zealand as well as make some amazing new friends and connections in the process.

As we step out in obedience to serve, we rely on others to give, in obedience and trust in God as we journey together. We have learnt a lot about being obedient, even when doing so seems a bit crazy. We have learnt to be generous as others are generous to us.

At the end of the day, I don't think I'd want to go back to a life where I was comfortable enough to not rely on God. Instead we're about to step it up a notch, heading to lead MMM Fiji on 2 April, flying with Air New Zealand for free on flights we won in December 2019. We will finally get to use our three-year work visa that started a year ago.

We thank God for the provision and guidance He has given us over the last couple of years. Please pray for us as we have so many decisions to make and things to do before leaving the country. Pray also that we have good health as we do these tasks. Please pray that the move goes smoothly, that we all settle into the Fijian lifestyle well and that we allow God to continually lead and guide us.

This ministry has a heart to reach out to Israeli backpackers and travellers and it was great to meet Micheal Thomas, the director, who came for a few days at the start, as well as being looked after by Nicki Smith and Sophie Smithies who cooked all our meals and cared for us so generously.

There were some travellers who passed through the hostel while we were there and it was great to see how they very naturally shared the gospel with those people and told their testimonies. It was obvious that it came from hearts of sincerity and people with a vision to care for Israelis and celebrate the Israeli culture. It was cool to see these travellers looking so full of pride and appreciation for being Israelis - their eyes lit up as the staff shared their vision to make Israeli meals and to celebrate Israeli customs for them.

On the job, Sam, a local guy, gave a hand to get all the supplies ordered for us. Initially the job was to reclad and reroof the staff house, although some of us women got pretty keen to tidy the gardens too, as the staff had been super busy over Christmas and New Year and had little time to do that. Andrea, Bethany and I learnt how to prune flax bushes, so it's pretty cool to now have that in my repertoire of skills.

We started with Mike Nicholls, Andrea and Mike Arthur and Gerard and Femmy Van Leeuwen. We also had Nathan Kelly help us for two days the first week, Ronnie McArthur for a couple of days, Dean and Lois Farrow for a week and their friends Des and Evelyn Ruby



We re-insulated, reroofed, re-clad, installed new soffits, new gutters and under-floor insulation. There was a heap of painting with the new colours of blue and cream, replacing the DOC yellow and green theme. Femmy, along with Kadesh, did a lot of the stripping and painting. Gerard worked away with Dean getting the cladding on and just helping anywhere and everywhere. Alan, he was kept busy keeping everyone else on task and making sure we didn't linger too long over tantalising morning and afternoon teas as well as trying to do all the fiddly bits like the corners and around windows etc. which he, being a details man, likes to do. I was asked to make some signs for the hostel, which was super fun, art is rather a passion of mine!

Thankfully, the weather was fine most of the time (which is incredible on the West Coast!) and the only day it rained they put up a tarp and kept on working!

All in all, a very successful job was completed with good fellowship

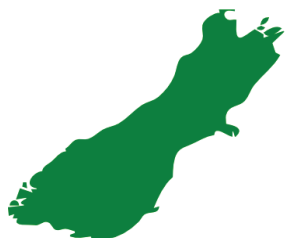
