UNASHAMED





In late July, a team went to assist Luke Collis and family for their newly relocated, off-grid home in Elsthorpe, Hawkes Bay. We were graciously hosted by members of The Station Church in Hastings but this resulted in a 45 minute commute each way! We successfully built a deck, a shed for their solar power and water pump equipment, reframed a portion of the house and installed a new bi-fold door, some interior decorating was done and curtains sewn. Team Leaders - Roy & Rachael Hogan, Chris Pynenburg, Ronnie McArthur, Murray and Anne Packer (first week), Stephen Douglas (second week).

Luke has a passion and gift in evangelism. Why would MMM assist someone with their home? As the founder of UNASHAMED we want to support Luke by helping him get his home liveable so he can focus on what he does so well, share the Gospel! Read on to learn how Luke is reaching out to the youth of Aotearoa!

"Don't ever put pressure on yourself to lead somebody to Christ. Honestly, it's actually not you who leads people to Christ. It's Jesus – He draws people.

"We're the sowers in that process and sometimes we get to be the reapers, but He gets the increase - we have to trust people in God's hands."

Luke Collis is passionate about evangelism and reaching the lost. Based in the Hawke's Bay, he heads up a team - mostly "amazing volunteers" - who help facilitate an outreach movement called LINASHAMED.

Since 2016, Luke and his team have been following a prompting of God on a two-fold mission — to see every young person in New Zealand reached with the message of Jesus and to raise up a movement of Christian young people committed to doing the same. The roots of UNASHAMED formed in Ngāruawāhia, Luke says. "Myself and a group of young adults started hanging out with some youth at the skatepark. Many were young people dealing with neglect and the fact there were times when their parents weren't home and they were struggling for food."

For two years, Luke essentially became a youth pastor of a youth group of mainly young people who'd never set foot in a church. "In that season, God opened my eyes to the fact so many young people are open. The thing holding them back wasn't that they'd heard the message of Jesus and rejected it - they'd never actually heard it. For so many, when they were presented with the message of Jesus in an authentic, genuine way they were hungry." That desire led to discussions about how to be as creative as

possible when reaching out with the Gospel message - and ultimately an UNASHAMED event was held - full of the creative arts, spoken word, drama and music - all summed up with the challenge to come to Jesus.

"Lots of the students from the local high school gave their lives to Christ - news spread like wildfire," Luke says.

"We ended up partnering with about 20 Waikato youth groups to run a city-wide UNASHAMED event in Hamilton.

That initial event opened the door for another event – followed by gatherings in Tauranga, Whanganui - then all over New Zealand. "Young people are hungry for Jesus - they need an encounter with Him - from there, everything changes."

Luke says in New Zealand, there are about 700,000 young people aged 13-25. Approximately 600,000 of those don't go to church. "We can look at it this way - raising up those 100,000 young people to share their faith is key to how I believe we will reach the 600,000 young people for Jesus. If those 100,000 people shared the Gospel with just six people who don't know Christ, our whole nation would be reached."

So, are there steps we can take as Christians to be more effective in sharing our faith with people?

"Connecting with those who don't know Jesus doesn't need to be forced or awkward – just start a conversation. In the moments where you have a chance to share, you've got to be sensitive to the Holy Spirit as to what to share at what time, and then trust God with the results." - An excerpt from The Authentic magazine, used with permission.

GROWING UP IN MMM

"Hey Mum! We quickly drove past this church in Nelson this morning. Am I right in saying this is the one with the massive tree (to the right) where our bus was parked for a while??? I flashed back when I saw it!"

The above was a random message I recently received from our adult son Lance, when he was visiting Nelson, and yes, he was right! When he was about eight years old, we spent several weeks repairing and painting that church. The kids loved the ginormous gum tree in front of the church and had a lot of fun climbing around it. There are many churches, camps and ministries around New Zealand that could look familiar to our, now adult children because when they were young we spent five years living in a house bus travelling New Zealand, serving on MMM projects. With the busy-ness of life, I don't think about that time much but just before I received Lance's message, Rosina Mitchell sent in her article (below) reminding me of many great memories. Rosina, her husband Alan and their three daughters also travelled with us from time to time. As Rosina so aptly describes it, at times it certainly did seem a bit mad! However, I would also agree with Rosina's thoughts that growing up on MMM projects exposed our kids to great people; wonderful examples! There are many still ask after them today.

These days there is a lot of worry ensuring we are providing children with all they need. I did at times feel our kids were missing out on those things you learn in childhood, music lessons, dance lessons, gymnastics, etc. But I can honestly say, God provides. As adults our kids, play musical instruments, lead worship and can dance. At different times in different places, they did have those opportunities. Not in the conventional way perhaps, of regular lessons, from a regular teacher but God provided. When my husband Howard first floated the idea of living in a house bus and serving with MMM I remember telling him, "But, we've got kids!" To which he replied, "God knows we have kids and if he has called us, he has called them." And they have not "missed out".

The Hogan's who are serving with MMM at present and moving around to different projects have discovered their children find the question, "Where are you from?" Hilarious, because they don't know!

Life on the road for our family did have its amusing moments too! Once, we arrived in Dunedin separately; I had driven our van, and Howard the bus. When I arrived Howard called to let me

know where he was parked. When I took the call, I was in a shop and when I got off the phone Lance asked, "So, do you know where home is now Mum?" It must have sounded a funny question; what kind of a mother doesn't know where home is!? But that's what our bus was, home, and it moved!

I remember reading a newsletter from a missionary friend who was serving on a medical ship. Her comment that stuck with me was, "Mission life is so interesting, I don't know why more people don't try it!" I would concur. It certainly is an interesting life that has created some great memories!

May I ask, what stops you from serving with MMM? What are you afraid of? Talk to us! We as a family have found God faithful. We would love to share our journey. - Ave Robinson



MUM, ROSINA SHARES THEIR MMM JOURNEY

Why do you serve on MMM projects? Alan and I serve on MMM projects because when we got married

our main shared interest was that we both wanted to do mission work. We had been to the Philippines on a YWAM DTS outreach and we had been impacted by the needs in third world countries and really wanted to spend our lives serving others. The motto of YWAM is "We are blessed to be a blessing," which married well with MMM's, "Serving those who Serve". We had looked at different ministries and Alan really wanted to work for a building ministry. By chance a friend told us about an MMM project that was near where we lived. We met Howard, Ave and kids and the rest is history! We started when our kids were 5, 7 and 8 and now they are 22, 24 and 25! We all loved our years of travelling in our house truck and doing MMM work projects, some years full-time and some part-time. Most years we

have been involved in at least one project.

What makes it enjoyable?

The people of course! The amazing ministries we get to serve all over New Zealand that are growing and thriving is awesome. The workers who become like family to us. Our kids have had amazing surrogate grandparents - Clive and Esther Dennis, Arthur and Anne Davis, Bart and Muriel Gilmore, Gerard and Femmy Van Leeuwen - just some of those people who have such a deep faith and were 'safe' people our kids grew up

around. We would be heading off to an MMM project on a Monday morning, probably frazzled from packing the truck up or maybe just skimmed through another COF (warrant) going down the road thinking, "Are we mad? Who else leaves all their security of home, wages, etc, and does free labour for ministries?" Then Bart

and Muriel would pass us in their bus and say, "Let's stop for an ice cream in the next town!" We'd feel so, so happy to see them! Alan and I love to build our team into family and I've learnt through

MMM training on giftings that one of mine is that I love it when people get along well together and work as a team. Sharing meals and most importantly doing our daily devotions are a real strength of MMM in team building I think. With Alan the builder and me loving to organise meals and put the jug on, I think we make a good team. I hope we can have many more experiences like those we have been so privileged to be involved in. We are so grateful to Howard and Ave for believing in us and trusting us with

so much responsibility of leading teams over the years when often we feel so much like we just bumble along half the time on a wing and a prayer!
