# **Overseas Projects**

# **TONGA TEAM**

Rebuilding a home for a long serving missionary following a Tsunami in Tonga.

The Hunga Tonga Hunga Ha'apai volcano erupted on the 21 January 2022 causing widespread damage across Tonga, with ash and tsunami damage to Nukualofa, Tongatapu. The house Theresa Lourente (Director, CEF Tonga Child Evangelism Fellowship) lived in was hit by the tsunami, causing considerable damage by the force of the water that flooded her house.

In conjunction with Christian Community Churches of New Zealand (GC3), Tongan Gospel Fellowship, MMM New Zealand and Child Evangelism Fellowship of New Zealand, a plan was made to build Theresa a new house.

The foundations, floor and blockwork was completed by local builders. In December 2022 a container was purchased in New Zealand and loaded with essential building materials, plus some furniture and household goods. Once it arrived in Tonga, with help from local church members, a considerable amount of it was unpacked a few days before the team arrived in March.

We saw the Lord's provision and mercy as, at that stage, the Tongan government required all non Tongans entering the country to be vaccinated, and there were a number on the team who would not have been able to enter Tonga. After much prayer and approaches to the government agencies there, permission was given for them to enter Tonga so we had our full complement of team members.

In March, 13 Kiwis, mostly from the Waikato region and two from Auckland, landed in Tonga to continue on with the build.

With the arrival of the team it was full on. In Week One the roof was on, and painting and electrical work was on the go.

Week Two saw the windows, doors, interior linings, painting, plumbing, electrical wiring, tiling, etc. get done.

Colleen and Graeme McNae, who had been missionaries in Tonga, for a number of years came on the team and we were blessed by their service in cooking for the team, driving the team and for Graeme translating in the church services and studies.

On the 31 March,Theresa's new home, which is located on land owned by the Tonga Gospel Fellowship, was dedicated and blessed.

Also, on behalf of the team, I would like to say thank you to the eldership and members of the Tongan Gospel Fellowship for their warm welcome and blessings given to us, for the hard work they put in organising the accommodation in the church hall, and thanks to all the team who worked hard, and saw the results of their work.

Our thanks to Theresa and all who support her in her work there, for the meals and fellowship we enjoyed.

# MMM Conference 2023 Woodend, Christchurch




Why have an MMM conference? What would MMM do at a conference? Is an MMM conference like a trade show where we swap building advice and argue over the best brand of power tool?

Connection is everything in Fiji, relationships are important and it's not what you know but who you know that will help you out in life. In the last few months we were able to reconnect with ministries and projects that MMM has journeyed with in the past.

# HOATU-KAIMUA, YWAM, KAIMAI RANGES

A note from a Project Recipient we served, Jewel-Anita Hendrix

We were fortunate to have MMM with us for three weeks in March.

It was such a relief and boost to our ministry. Ignite 6:8 is a YWAM ministry that works to help churches and YWAM students and staff be active in the justice and compassion issues in their own community (Micah 6:8). We work with different community organizations which are serving the vulnerable and working in the areas of homelessness, poverty, domestic violence, sexual exploitation, abortion, etc. We train any of the body of Christ in wholistic ministry and transformational development, seeking to empower people to engage effectively with the issues in their own community. We also manage a 38-bed bush lodge in the Kaimai Mamaku forest, Hoatu Kaimua. We run the tourist lodge as "business as missions" to pay the costs



of maintenance, while also having a space for churches and those in ministry to run retreats, workshops and find refreshment and restoration.

MMM came and helped with so many projects that we had. When the team was almost done, one of our regular volunteers said, "It looks like a whole new place." A bit after MMM left, we had a group of young girls who were also with us a year ago. One 12 year old exclaimed, "Yea, it's so much better now. We're not afraid to use the

bathroom anymore."

Lejf's leadership of the team kept the different projects moving smoothly while he also fixed random other things that we had been told could not possibly be fixed. The bathroom refresh was an obvious win. But the team also found solutions that other builders and tradies had no solution for. They built a new laundry area, a mud room, fixed bunks, boxed in places that rodents entered, and so much more.

We appreciated not only the work, but also the daily prayer for our ministry. Their work lifted off a huge weight and brought breakthrough that was clearly physical but also spiritual. We are so grateful to MMM, each member of the team and to God for the time spent with us and the work that was accomplished. # Woodend Christian Camp, Christchurch


An MMM team spent the week before and the week after the MMM conference working on maintenance at the Woodend Christian Camp. They stained the exterior of the
