LETTER FROM THE

September 2022

Recently at church we enjoyed watching a dramatized version of Mark's gospel put on by the Tertiary Student Christian Fellowship group from the Waikato University. It was incredibly well done with all the words of Jesus being straight out of the gospel, and the rest of the actors using the biblical narrative and setting the scene in a spontaneous way, with no props or costumes, but with plenty of humour and emotion.

One of the stories that I enjoyed in the drama was the feeding of the 5,000 where the people had been following Jesus and listening to his teaching and, as it got late, needed feeding. Jesus challenged the disciples to feed the people. But all they could find from the crowd was five loaves and two fish. It was hilarious to watch the disciples 'actors' surprise at the pretend bread being constantly broken off by Jesus, and were enthusiastically throwing out bread and fish to the audience, because they had so much to give away.

Jesus took what they had and multiplied it. We may not feel we have much to offer, when we know the task of taking the gospel to the nations is so huge. But Jesus is not asking us to go out and just do it on our own. He is wanting us to not only acknowledge our total inability to meet the need, but to have the confidence that when we give ourselves to him, he will do all that is required to satisfy the hunger of the people.

MMM FIJI IS BACK IN ACTION

After a three year pause on projects in Fiji, we are super excited to be back in action! It has been a busy few months finding our feet and getting things up and running again. There has been a lot of meeting people, understanding ministries and needs, looking at future projects, assessing buildings and working alongside organisations to prepare for when MMM can assist them.

There are ministries in Fiji that had projects approved dating back to 2018. However, due to the pandemic they are still waiting. Sadly some of these no longer have the funds needed to achieve their goals, or in other cases, their buildings have since deteriorated beyond being repaired, so the project has grown in size.

We are excited to finally be in the place God has called us to and to have the ability to partner with and support such welcoming, passionate people. There are so many amazing ministries in Fiji that need our help and we are enjoying the opportunities we are getting with this.

Fiji has a real lack of qualified and experienced tradespeople of all kinds. People are so grateful to just have the wisdom and knowledge of MMM. They appreciate having someone who knows what they are talking about and isn't trying to rip them off, to help them take the next step in the process.

We have experienced life as locals with vehicle issues being the norm. If you are a mechanic, you are welcome here anytime! Very little goes as you planned or in the time you expect it to be done; Fiji time is real. It will happen when it happens - you just need to be patient with expecting that. We are learning to be prepared for anything and not be surprised if everything changes with no notice.



The good news is that travelling to Fiji is easy and we have several upcoming projects, some with dates attached and some in the pipeline. Sabeto Christian Camp is the next project with lots of maintenance work to be done, then we head to Savusavu in October to repair a hurricane damaged building. Other projects on the horizon include:

- Homes of Hope in Suva, a ministry that provides a safe place for girls, young women and children who have experienced or are at risk of sexual abuse
- A Bible College in Lautoka where staff accommodation has been ravaged by termites and has bad leaking issues
- A missionary family with young children who have served in Fiji three years and are building a new home. They have had so many hurdles on their build already yet remain faithful and optimistic to serve in Fiji through training pastors and Biblical counselling, particularly to the outer islands

There are many churches and ministries in need of new construction, renovations or maintenance, but have no expertise and are just waiting for MMM to come and help. We have a great passion to not only help these ministries in Fiji but to enable locals to help themselves and their people. We know this is a huge task but we have a big God.

You may recall in the last issue of the MMM magazine reading Chris's story of serving on the Anchorage church project in Mosgiel. Now the family has been accepted to serve with MMM in 2023. Read on to see how that came about!

Our Father in Heaven works in wonderful ways. In 2013 during Jen's elective placement with her medical degree, we chose to go to Kalene Mission Hospital in Zambia, timing it with her father, Ross Pettigrew (retired surgeon). While there I met some workers who were volunteering as plumbers/electricians. I helped them out and enjoyed hearing their story about their volunteering with Brass Tacks (another overseas servant trades ministry). I was about to start my building apprenticeship at the time and remember talking to Jen about it saying; "What a dream that would be, to travel around and volunteer for the Lord's work", and what a great way to use my carpentry skills for the kingdom! Practically speaking, we assumed retirement would be our next available time to serve

this way, or when the kids grew up and left home. But now I had a long term goal with my carpentry

In 2021, I was in a church service reading the passage that was being preached on involving Haggai, and I was scrolling through other parts of the book. Haggai chapter one stood out to me quite vividly; "Is it a time for you yourselves to be living in your paneled houses, while this house remains a ruin ... while each of you is busy with your own house?" (v4 and 9). I was convicted silently there that day that I should be keeping my eyes open for a way to 'build the Lord's temple'

because at the time my wife and I were designing our own panelled house (using SIPS panels) in Dunedin!

Fast forward to 2022 when MMM came to Mosgiel (on a South Island Tiki Tour). I had an opportunity to serve on a project there and even take the Team Leader role. It was there that I heard of the need for qualified builders to become team leaders for MMM, and here we are, eager to serve for a full year, full time, to see what the Lord can accomplish through us in this way, and to see what the

Lord is doing throughout Aotearoa/New Zealand in the various ministries he is working in. Jen and I realise we have an opportunity to serve the Lord now, even with a young family, by being a team leader with MMM. Maybe we will get to build our own house afterwards, one day, but right now we want to stop being busy working on our own house, and restore and build up the Lord's 'temple', his Church, ministries and people.

Although we originally had other plans for 2023, we kept our hands open, not shut. So here we are, ready to serve in this very direct way with MMM, for God's glory! At the Mount Maunganui evening Mark Fox shared his appreciation of the work done in transforming


some of the MAF hangar into offices and accommodation.

Prayer is the underpinning structure of the ministry of MMM. There are several groups around New Zealand which meet monthly to pray for the work along with many who receive our monthly *Prayer Force*. We invited one to the Prayer Fellowship hosts to write about why they pray for MMM.

MMM has woven itself into our lives in various ways. We first became more fully aware of MMM's ministry when one of our elders, David Halse, a builder, felt the call of God to sell his home in Titahi Bay to join MMM. Our church commissioned David and his wife Jenny in January 1999. Later that year Howard and Ave Robinson brought their family and mobile home to our church in Titahi Bay to help us build an extension. That was October 1999. Later, after nearly nine years of missionary service in Papua New Guinea 2000-2008, we returned to our home in Tawa to find it badly needed its exterior painted. MMM were a wonderful team to help us get that job done. How blessed we felt!

Some years later, when David and June Gennard offered their home in Tawa as a venue for a monthly (Porirua) Prayer Fellowship Group in support of MMM, we gladly joined it and have been continuing members of that group ever since.

While we are only a small group praying for the ministry of MMM, it has deepened the concern and commitment of our members. So much so, that the more practical members have

joined in several projects. This process of growing interest and commitment has more recently led to Dave and June selling up and joining MMM on a full-time basis. And another member of our group, Stephen Douglas, has become an Associate.

We think of ourselves as not only a prayer

cell for MMM, but also a group with a personal interest in the Gennards as well. Visits from time to time of MMM Project team members update us on their contributions to MMM's work or current projects. Such visits have been a great stimulus to prayer.

Along the way, our monthly meetings have deepened our understanding of prayer as the unseen framework that is the most significant tool in the work of God. We have thought of the many different aspects of MMM's service and how they relate to our Christian life and building the Kingdom of God – our foundations, our walls, our windows, our doors all have lessons to teach us about our life with God and our fellowship with one another.

We certainly would like to invite more people to strengthen the work of MMM by joining a group or forming an MMM prayer cell near them. In the final analysis, individual and group prayer is the most vital way of contributing to the ministry of MMM and God's work in the world. - Ossie and Jenny Fountain

Hope Rising Farm Trust

"We recently heard about Mobile Mission Maintenance through one of our volunteers. As we are currently in the process of setting up a new property for our charity...", That's how this particular project for Hope Rising got started - good old word of mouth!



What is Hope Rising Farm? Hope Rising provides an empowering journey for vulnerable youth and women to develop life skills, confidence, trust and respect. By partnering with our friendly horses and donkeys. They learn to trust and have confidence in themselves and others in a relaxed environment through learning horsemanship skills and contributing to farm tasks. Working with the horses and on the farm, they can practice skills in a safe and fun learning environment and realise that in changing themselves, they have the power to influence the world around them.



The reality for some of our young people is that difficult life and family circumstances, or addiction to drugs and alcohol can put them out of step and in the wrong direction, where poor lifestyle choices are made. Youth in foster care are

three to six times more likely than youth not in care to have emotional, behavioural and developmental problems, including conduct disorders, depression, difficulties in school and impaired social relationships. However, horses don't care what you look like or what clothes you wear. They don't care where you've been or what you know. They offer unconditional friendship based on leadership, trust and respect.

The MMM team spent three weeks renovating an old shed into a feed room, tack room, break room and arena for training. Following the project, Hope Rising team wrote a thank you card to the team in which different team members wrote. It said;-

"Guys, you have been awesome. You have moved us ahead in a fantastic way. I praise God for your willingness to move his Kingdom forward."

"Just blown away by your mahi! Thank you so much for coming out!"


